



Quiet Time Questions from 02/15/26

Start your quiet time each day with prayer. Ask the LORD to help you focus and understand what you are studying.

MAIN POINT OF THIS WEEK'S MESSAGE: As Christians, everything we need to continue in joy and to grow in the faith is found in the One who is our everything—the Lord Jesus Christ. And as we have obeyed the Lord in the past by sending out members, will we once again look to Him as our all-sufficient joy and prepare our hearts—both personally and collectively—to give away members?

MEMORY VERSE FOR THE WEEK: *“How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, “Your God reigns.”” (Isaiah 52:7)*

1. **Read Romans 10:1-4.** Paul writes to the church in Rome with a burdened heart for his fellow Jews, that they might come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. He desires that they would stop relying on their own efforts to keep the Law as a means of righteousness and instead receive the righteousness God provides through faith in Christ. Who do we know that is still striving to earn what can only be received by grace? For whom should we be praying, that they too would rest in the finished work of Christ? For whom should we be praying that “they” would be saved?
2. **Read Romans 10:5-13.** Paul is confident that the proclamation of the Gospel will have an effect on those who hear it, whether they be Jew or Greek, *For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. For “everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”* How more confidently might we pray knowing that God’s word *shall not return unto Him empty, but it shall accomplish that which He purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which He sent it?* (Knowing that when “they” call on the Lord, “they” will be saved.) **Romans 10:12, Isaiah 55:11**
3. **Read Romans 10:14-17.** In the last four (4) verses from the Scripture from Sunday’s sermon, Paul includes a quote from Isaiah 52:7, *How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, “Your God reigns.* Take time this week to consider and pray for those whom the Lord is calling, to be sent from Immanuel to proclaim the Good News of Salvation.
